ELKS NATIONAL FOUNDATION REPORT

Members of #572, the "Great heart of Elkdom" deserves our attention and support! This year, we are receiving \$1,500 in return from the ENF, for use in the Murphysboro Community (details in next month's Bulletin). Yearly, we usually have one or more Scholarship winners, who each receive \$2,000 or more.

How are ENF funds distributed? Consider these figures from 2009-2010: State Grants \$7,222,040 (40.9%); Scholarships \$3,306,555 (18.7%); Veterans Memorial \$1,525,136 (8.6%); Youth Program \$1,520,284 (8.6%); Community Investments \$1.002.062 (5.7%): Veteran's Service \$950,515 (5.2%); Other \$393,463 (2.2%); and Administrative expenses \$1,731.885 (9.8%). (Note that the 9.8% Administrative is well below the Better Business Bureau's standard for Charity accountability, which is 35% or less.)

Lodge #572 is proud to continue a tradition of meeting our yearly, ENF per-capita goal! This year, the target in IL is set at \$5.50 per member. This amount will come from both Your Individual Donation to the ENF, and the 3 planned Shooting Matches for this coming winter. If you have taken the time to read this article, now you know what we are all working for, and why YOU can feel good about providing time, talent or funds to the Elks National Foundation!
