uring the last weekend of September I attended the Illinois Elks Fall State Meeting in Springfield. Along with the usual camaraderie and exchange of ideas, there were a few things I want to share with all of you. As you know, the Illinois Elks Association helps children with numerous types of difficulties with everyday mobility through the Children's Care Corporation (CCC). In addition to providing therapy, surgery, and equipment to help youth throughout the state, they also provide scholarships to students studying physical and occupational therapy. It only makes sense that if we provide the therapy we can also help provide the therapists. During the Saturday night banquet, the top eight scholarship applicants were introduced. Four of the applicants were presented with the top scholarship awards for the year. I am proud to announce that of the four award recipients, two of them were sponsored by our Lodge; all four were sponsored by the South district.

he state officers decided that in addition to continuing the SOS program, which sends care packages to active military personnel serving overseas,

a program should be established to help fund sending Illinois veterans on the Honor Flight. The Honor Flight network is a nonprofit organization that takes veterans on a daytrip to Washington D.C. to visit the memorials that honor their service to their country (at no expense to the veterans). The goal is to provide funding for two veterans from each district to participate. My father travelled on the Honor Flight out of Milwaukee on September 19th. He described the day as "the experience of a lifetime" and said that "every veteran needs to go." As he described over the phone the 5000 people (literally) that greeted the veterans as they returned, he began to cry. It was the first time I ever saw or heard my father shed a tear. During the final meeting of the weekend, it was voted unanimously to undertake this effort. The program is still evolving, and vou will hear more about it in the future. ELKS SCHOLARSHIPS

All High School Seniors are eligible to apply for our ENF, "Most Valuable Student" Scholarships. The ENF awards \$2.296 Million annually in college scholarships to 500 seniors, nationwide, through the MVS contest. Award amounts range from \$4,000 (\$1,000 per year) to \$60,000 (\$15,000 per year). Deadline for applications to be submitted to Lodge #572 is 10 p.m., Wed., December 1

Also, the ENF's **LEGACY** program (up to 250 four-year, \$4,000 Scholarships) is for children and grandchildren of ACTIVE **ELK** MEMBERS.
