ELKS SCHOLARSHIPS

Most Valuable Student Program is open to any high school senior who is a U.S. citizen. Applications are available on the **ENF** website (www.elks.org/enf/scholars), from high school guidance counselors. Applications must be submitted on or before Dec. 2, 2011, to the Elks Lodge closest to the student's permanent residence. A record of strong performance in Scholarship (G.P.A & ACT / SAT Scores), Leadership (Inc. Community Service). and demonstration of Financial Need are used as judging criteria. Selection of winners begins at the local Lodge level and continues through district, state, and national judging.

Also, for Seniors who are children, grandchildren or legal wards of a living Elk who joined the Order on or before April 1, 2009, the Legacy Scholarship Program is available, with 11 awards to be given in Illinois. Applications are available online only at the site given above. Criteria includes Knowledge, Charity, Community, and Integrity. Deadline to submit application online (only) is February 1, 2012.
