Members All,

We have successfully made it through the month of August, and our Lodge is finally starting to feel a little more like it did back in February. Over the last month, we have been able to sustain our operations through the hard work and dedication of both our employees and our volunteering members. We have been happy to comply with the current regulations to offer a welcoming and safe environment for our members to enjoy, and it has been great to see the return of many of you. Please notice that we are now also requiring a mask upon entry to the club to assist in promoting this environment.

We are currently printing the raffle tickets to begin selling for the raffle mentioned in the last newsletter. These tickets will be sold at ten dollars each for a chance to win either \$500, \$250, or \$100. The money that results from this raffle will be used to replenish the building fund, which has taken a blow due to various freezer/cooler issues that the Lodge has faced over the last few months. The drawing will be held on Saturday, October 24th, and both the clubroom and back hall will be open to allow for distancing between participating members. The winner need not be present to win, and tickets can be sold to non-members. Please encourage as many ticket sales as possible, as we hope that this fundraiser will provide extra assistance to the Lodge!

On the topic of extra assistance, the Grand Lodge has awarded <u>\$1,500</u> to every Lodge in the country in the form of a one-time Covid relief payment. We are very appreciative to receive these funds and send our thanks to the Grand Lodge. However, our current list of delinquent members is over twice as long as is typical for this time of year. We understand that many members have not felt comfortable returning to the Lodge at this time, but we humbly ask that members pay their dues as soon as possible if they have not already done so. These payments will greatly aid in the Lodge returning to a higher level of financial stability.

Most Valuable Student (MVS)

Open to ANY High School Senior who is a U.S. Citizen. Judging Criteria: Academics, Leadership, Financial Need, and Service. 500 4-yr. awards as follows: Two \$50,000; Two \$40,000; Two \$30,000; 14 \$20,000; 480 \$4,000. Applications are available online at enf.elks.org/ MVS and are due online on or before November 15, 2020.

Legacy Awards

Open to College-bound high school seniors who are the children or grandchildren of duespaying Elks. 350 scholarships at \$4,000 each. Judging based on applicant's commitment to the core values of the ENF: Knowledge, Community Service, Charity, and Integrity. (Legacy scholars are required to serve with the Elks throughout college, to receive their scholarship funds.) Applications available online starting September 1, 2020, at enf.elks.org/Leg. Due online on or before February 5, 2021 at 11:59 a.m. Central Time.

ENF LEGACY AWARDS

These 300 scholarships are worth \$4,000 ea., and are open to college-bound high school seniors who are children or grandchildren of dues-paying Elks. Applicants compete against other children & grandchildren from the state of their sponsoring Lodge. Judging based on core values of the ENF: Knowledge, Charity, Community Service, and Integrity. Applications available online starting September 1, 2019 and ending on January 31, 2020 at 11:59 a.m. Central Time. For details, visit enf.elks.org/leg.

Emergency Educational Grants

Provides undergraduate college financial assistance to children of deceased or totally disabled Elks in the form of renewable, one-year grants of up to \$5,000. (This grant is for educational assistance only and is not intended to cover the entire cost of a college education.) Eligibility: attend an accredited U.S. college or university as a full-time (12 semester hours) undergraduate student; demonstrate financial need; be unmarried & under the age of 24 during the academic year for which assistance is desired. Applications available by request between May 1 and November 2 of the academic year for which assistance is desired.
