Members all,

The month of May brings welcomed warm weather and plenty of opportunity to enjoy your Lodge and/or the company of the friends you find there. A number of events are on the agenda this month, beginning with the South District Soccer Shoot held at the soccer complex in Marion on May 1st. There will be an organized tournament playing simultaneously on the fields, but any child under 15 can participate, regardless of whether or not they play on any teams! The winners of this shoot will advance to the next round at the Illinois State level. We will also be resuming our Mother's Day celebration with a free brunch to mothers in the back hall. The first Illinois Elks Association Meeting in over a year will take place on Saturday, May 15th, with an abbreviated schedule after the hiatus due to covid. Lodge #572 will be fully represented by all required officers in compliance with the guidelines of the IEA. 
