

Most Valuable Student (MVS)

Open to ANY High School Senior who is a U.S. Citizen. Judging Criteria: Academics, Leadership, Financial Need, and Service. 500 4-yr. awards as follows: Two \$50,000; Two \$40,000; Two \$30,000; 14 \$20,000; 480 \$4,000. Applications are now available online at enf.elks.org/MVS and are due online on or before November 15, 2021.

Legacy Awards

Open to Colleg-bound high school seniors who are the children or grandchildren of dues-paying Elks. 350 scholarships at \$4,000 each. Judging based on applicant's commitment to the core values of the ENF: Knowledge, Community Service, Charity, and Integrity. (Legacy scholars are required to serve with the Elks throughout college, to receive their scholarship funds.) Applications are now available online, at enf.elks.org/Leg. Due online on or before February 7, 2022 at 11:59 a.m. Central Time.

Emergency Educational Grants

Provides undergraduate college financial assistance to children of deceased or totally disabled Elks in the form of renewable, one-year grants of up to \$5,000. (This grant is for educational assistance only and is not intended to cover the entire cost of a college education.) Eligibility: attend an accredited U.S. college or university as a full-time (12 semester hours) undergraduate student; demonstrate financial need; be unmarried & under the age of 24 during the academic year for which assistance is desired. Applications available by request between May 1 and November 2 of the academic year for which assistance is desired. GREAT NEWS ON THE ENERGY FRONT FOR LODGE #572

The Board of Directors of Murphysboro Elks #572 is pleased to announce that our Lodge has been selected to participate in an Ameren Illinois incentive program, which will result in the replacement of ALL LIGHTING - INDOORS AND OUT - with new LED units! Under a program, known as SBDI (Small Business Direct Install), we will see a \$7,686.23 contract carried forth, for which the Lodge will pay only \$200.00! Monthly savings are estimated to be around \$275.00, with yearly savings put at some \$3,310.42! Lodge Officers feel fortunate that we have the opportunity to take advantage of this program. Think of the savings it achieve over upcoming years. (And, add on the 50% energy reduction in heating / cooling of the Lodge Hall, with the new mini-split installation, and the savings add up even more!)





Congratulations to Maggie Williams, 2021 MHS Senior, who was selected as Elks Teen-Of-The-Year for both Lodge #572, as well as the Illinois Elks South District. Maggie was awarded \$100 from the Murphysboro Lodge and \$500 from the South District. Our winner is also shown, proudly displaying a plaque from the Elks South District.

IT'S GONE!!

A large Heating / Air Conditioning unit was installed when the current Lodge #572 building was constructed in 1996. Thanks to hard work by Jim and Ted Ferguson, the unit was scrapped out and new sheet metal placed in the wall where it had been located. Thanks to Mike Clutts, who donated time to the wall situation, and to Steve Schemonia, who worked on procuring matching, replacement metal. Two of the Hall's six, small, mini-split units appear in photo, on both sides of where the original unit was located. And, their efficiency is roughly double that of the old, traditional unit!
